Additional Bulletin Board Ideas

I Want S'MORE of Jesus

Make a giant s'more on the board using the s'more art (2). Using white paper, cut out marshmallows. Using brown paper, cut out graham crackers. Using black paper, cut out chocolate squares. Place them around the s'more and label them with things that help us get closer to Jesus (e.g., prayer, Bible reading, church, godly friends, worship, and so on).

Make round cutouts of your students' faces and add them to snowmen cutouts. Or take a group photo, cut it out, and put it in a giant snow globe.

THE BETTER PLAN God's Better Plan for Mary

CORE SUPPLIES

Excite and Engage

Welcome: If you have not done so already, cut out and glue students' photos to their attendance ski passes (AP) (3). Create a few guest passes. (*Optional:* Laminate the passes, hole-punch the tops, and attach them to lanyards.)

Attendance star stickers (AP) 🕒, markers, offering mug(s)

Opening Activity: Each pair of students needs a roll of toilet paper, scotch tape, scissors, and a stuffed animal. You will also need a timer.

Relate and Receive

Bible Lesson: Wedding veil, angel costume (halo and/or wings), Bibles

Apply and Act

Life Application: Whiteboard and markers, activity papers (page 1), pencils, timeline poster (TRP), beanbag

Prayer and Call to Action: New Birth poster (TRP)

Home Connection: For each student, copy the unit 1 **HC** calendar (TRP) (1) and the lesson 1 **HC** devotion (1). Separate the activity paper covers (AP) to send home. Prepare student information forms (2) for parents to fill out as they drop off or pick up their children.

EXPANDED SUPPLIES

Worship and the Word

Worship: Suggested songs: "Winter Snow" by Audrey Assad, "Lord, I Lift Your Name on High," "Glorious Day" by Casting Crowns

Memory Work: On 4 note cards write: CIRCLE, SQUARE, ZIGZAG, and TRIANGLE. Place the cards in a gift bag. If you have not done so already, cut out and hole-punch a memory mitten (AP) ① for each student. Cut yarn or ribbon into 3-inch lengths for students to tie in one hole on their mittens.

Cut apart the two sets of Hebrews 8:6–7 phrases (TRP) 🕘. These will be used again in lesson 2.

Reinforce and Review

Activity Paper: Activity papers (page 2), pencils

- **Option 1:** Search the internet for how to make "flashlight hand puppets" and practice making different ones. Students will need flashlights.
- **Option 2:** On posterboard, draw a large circle divided into 8 sections. Inside every other section, write numbers 1–4. Draw a star in the remaining four sections. (See page 10.) Mark one end of a fidget spinner with tape to create a pointer. You will need small treats or prizes.
- **Option 3:** Select and print one set of JBQ Verses (2) for students to take home. Research Junior Bible Quizzing at the website, www.najbq.com.

Teacher Devotional

Read Hebrews 1. Prayerfully consider what this passage says:

About God

As the creator of the universe, the almighty God could have been exempt from facing the pain and suffering that life can bring. Even so, He chose to manifest in the flesh and then subjected Himself to the human experience. His love and desire for our salvation was His motivation.

To You as a Teacher

We should approach each day with a thankful spirit, knowing that the God of all creation came to save each of us individually. Our actions and words should reflect a constant rejoicing in this knowledge. Daily displays of thanksgiving are in order toward the King of kings.

To Your Students

Some argue the Incarnation is a mystery. But Apostolics keep it simple: God became human to save us. What is the mystery? To students, the Incarnation does not have to be mysterious. God's love for us and our need for salvation propelled Him into this world in the form of a human. He planned and carried out our redemption before we even knew Him. A simple way to thank Him is to live for Him—the One who was born for us, who died for us, and who is coming back again for us.

CORE (designed for a teaching period around 45 minutes)

EXCITE AND ENGAGE

Welcome

As students arrive, invite them into the Snow Quest Ski Park. Allow them to look around the newly decorated room. Stimulate discussion:

- Who likes snow? What is your favorite thing to do in the snow?
- Who has been snow skiing, snowboarding, or ice skating?
- Have you ever made snow angels?

Distribute attendance ski passes (AP) (1). Instruct students to sign their names and add an attendance star (TRP) (1) to their passes to mark their visit to Snow Quest Ski Park.

Select a volunteer to collect offering and lead everyone in saying the Bible point: **God became flesh to save us.**

Opening Activity: The Big Day

Give each pair of students a stuffed animal, a roll of scotch tape, scissors, and a roll of toilet paper. Give them four minutes to create a toilet-paper wedding dress for their bride-to-be (stuffed animal). When time is called, vote on the best bridal gown.

- How long does it take to plan a wedding?
- What preparations must be made?

We (the people in the church) are called the bride of Christ. God wanted to be with His bride, but sin separated us from Him. God did not let that stop Him. He created a plan to once again be with us (His bride). It took years and years and years to prepare. One day, a young bride-to-be named Mary would have her wedding plans disrupted in order to fulfill the greatest plan of all time—the birth of Jesus Christ.

Bible Lesson Verse

"Who being the brightness of his glory, and the express image of his person, and upholding all things by the word of his power, when he had by himself purged our sins, sat down on the right hand of the Majesty on high" (Hebrews 1:3).

Luke 1:26–29

²⁶And in the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent from God unto a city of Galilee, named Nazareth, ²⁷to a virgin espoused to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David; and the virgin's name was Mary. ²⁸And the angel came in unto her, and said, Hail, thou that art highly favoured, the Lord is with thee: blessed art thou among women. ²⁹And when she saw him, she was troubled at his saying, and cast in her mind what manner of salutation this should be.

Luke 1:30–33

³⁰And the angel said unto her, Fear not, Mary: for thou hast found favour with God. ³¹And, behold, thou shalt conceive in thy womb, and bring forth a son, and shalt call his name JESUS. ³²He shall be great, and shall be called the Son of the Highest: and the Lord God shall give unto him the throne of his father David: ³³and he shall reign over the house of Jacob for ever; and of his kingdom there shall be no end.

Luke 1:34–35

³⁴Then said Mary unto the angel, How shall this be, seeing I know not a man? ³⁵And the angel answered and said unto her, The Holy Ghost shall come upon thee, and the power of the Highest shall overshadow thee: therefore also that holy thing which shall be born of thee shall be called the Son of God.

Luke 1:36–38

³⁶And, behold, thy cousin Elisabeth, she hath also conceived a son in her old age: and this is the sixth month with her, who was called barren. ³⁷For with God nothing shall be impossible. ³⁸And Mary said, Behold the handmaid of the Lord; be it unto me according to thy word. And the angel departed from her.

RELATE AND RECEIVE

Access Prior Experience: Have you ever had to change your plans? What happened?

Bible Lesson: God's Better Plan for Mary (Luke 1:26-38)

Choose volunteers to play Mary and the angel. Put the veil on Mary and the halo on the angel. Stand between them. Ask students to look up Luke 1 in their Bibles.

Mary was planning to marry Joseph. Like every bride-to-be, she was probably spending all her free time planning for the big event. Ask Mary to give some details of her wedding plans (e.g., the colors, how the cake will look, what flowers she wants, and so on). Wow! Now I am excited about your wedding too.

Act like you heard the angel say something. **Wait, I think Gabriel wants to say something.** Gabriel whispers in your ear, and then you look sad. **Oh no. You say to Mary: I am sorry to tell you, Mary, but plans have changed. Gabriel says God has another plan.** Ask a volunteer to read Luke 1:26–29.

When Mary first saw the angel Gabriel, she was afraid. How would you act if you suddenly saw an angel appear before you?

God did not want Mary to be frightened. He sent Gabriel to her to deliver good news. Ask a volunteer to read Luke 1:30–33. At first, this change of plan confused Mary. In her day, a woman who had a baby before marriage was considered an outcast. Family and friends would turn against her. Joseph certainly would not want to marry her.

But God knows our thoughts before we have them. Gabriel had God's answer to Mary's confusion. Ask a volunteer to read Luke 1:34–35.

This was no ordinary baby, and He would not come into the world in an ordinary way. This miracle baby—the long-awaited Messiah, the Son of God, the Savior of the world, Jesus—would have a miracle birth. Mary was chosen to give birth to a promise made many, many years earlier throughout the Old Testament.

To confirm to Mary that the impossible was indeed possible, God gave Mary a sign. Ask a volunteer to read Luke 1:36–38. Mary's cousin, Elizabeth, who was way beyond the years of having babies (a nice way of saying she was an old woman) was also miraculously expecting a child. By this Mary would know Gabriel's good news was true. Mary was no longer afraid to fulfill what God called her to do.

Students take off their costumes and return to their seats.

APPLY AND ACT Life Application: I am thankful God came to save me.

I Corinthians 2:7-8

⁷But we speak the wisdom of God in a mystery, even the hidden wisdom, which God ordained before the world unto our glory: ⁸Which none of the princes of this world knew: for had they known it, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory.

On the board write: INCARNATION. Define it as "God's plan to send a Messiah to save the Hebrew people and the world."

Ask a volunteer to read I Corinthians 2:7–8. Throughout the Old Testament, God kept His better plan a secret. If the devil's minions (the princes of this world) had understood who Jesus was, they never would have crucified Him. God waited until the perfect time to reveal His perfect plan to save humanity.

Here was the secret: This Messiah was God Himself in the flesh. Apparently the Hebrew people had lost sight of this plan, because it had been so long between its foretelling and its coming to fruition. God has plans for our lives. Sometimes it takes a long time to see those plans finally come to pass, but we must trust Him.

- How might our lives and our world be different if God had not come to save us?
- How do we show our thankfulness? By following God's Word and pursuing holiness

Distribute activity papers and pencils. Lay the timeline poster (TRP) on the floor. Have a volunteer toss a beanbag onto the poster. Whichever square it lands on will be the first square students fill out on their papers. Help students brainstorm about what their plans might be for ten, twenty-five, and fifty years from now versus what God's plans for them might be at those times. Play until students have tossed the bag onto every square and all the squares on their papers are completed.

Regardless of the plans we make, God is also making plans for us. His plans are always bigger and better, and they might cause us to change our plans.

Prayer and Call to Action

Are you willing to let God's plan become your plan? God's ultimate plan for our lives is for us to be saved. That is the whole reason He came to earth. God confirms this message by filling people with the Holy Ghost. Remember how Elizabeth was a confirmation to Mary? Well, the Holy Ghost is a confirmation to us.

Refer to the New Birth poster (TRP) and explain the plan of salvation. God made the best plan of all when He sent Jesus into the world to save us from our sins.

Lead students in a prayer of thanksgiving for God's plan for our lives. Ask Him to help us follow His plan. Be sensitive to students who want to respond to God's plan of salvation and pray for them to receive the Holy Ghost.

Home Connection

- For each student, send home a copy of the unit 1 AC calendar (TRP) (1) and the lesson 1 AC devotion (2), or show parents the URL on the back of the activity paper so they can download it themselves.
- Send home the cover of the activity paper, showing parents how the back contains the MV posters for the entire quarter. Encourage them to post it in a visible place, like the fridge.
- Use the student information form **(**) to get contact information from parents. This will be used to establish a home connection throughout the quarter.

WORSHIP AND THE WORD


Worship



Memory Work: Hebrews 8:6-7

Have a volunteer read the unit 1 MV poster (TRP). Define words that students may not be familiar with such as *mediator* and *covenant*. The first covenant (the Law and animal sacrifices) was not sufficient to completely remove sin. The better covenant (faith in Jesus' sacrifice on Calvary) is completely sufficient to remove sin. Therefore, it is a better covenant based upon better promises.



Form two teams. Give each team a set of Hebrews 8:6–7 phrases and a roll of tape. Teams draw a card from the bag (circle, square, zigzag, or triangle) and then compete to be the first to tape their phrases on the wall in that shape and recite them. Play a few rounds and then challenge teams to recite the verses from memory.

Distribute memory mittens (AP) (1). Students color them and write their names on them. Let them tie their first fringe in the unit 1 section. Collect the mittens so you can hang them.

REINFORCE AND REVIEW

Activity Paper

On the back of the activity papers, students fill in the blanks to complete the statements. Once finished, students write the circled letters in the blanks below to reveal the word that means "God's plan to come in flesh as the Messiah."

Challenge students to not only consider the plans they have made for this week but to seek to know God's plan for them too.

Option 1: Shadows and Light

Make hand puppet shadows on the wall. It is simple to understand that the shadows and the hands are one. Compare this to how the Old Testament foreshadowed things to come in the New Testament. Once Jesus, the Light of the World, came, humanity finally saw God's Spirit in flesh. Jesus was the incarnation of the invisible God. They are not two separate beings any more than our shadows and our bodies are two separate beings. There is one God and Jesus is His name.

Option 2: Circle of Thanks

Lay the prepared poster on a table. Place the fidget spinner in the middle of the poster and have students take turns spinning it. If the pointer lands on a number, the student counts around the circle starting with the student on his right until he reaches the student at that number. That student shares a reason she is thankful God came into this world, and then she receives a treat or prize. If the pointer lands on a star, the spinning student shares why he is thankful, and then he receives a treat or prize.

Option 3: JBQ Introduction

Introduce the concept of Junior Bible Quizzing. Hand out one set of JBQ Verses **(**.). Explain that each week, a fun activity will help students review the material.

Option: If you have some JBQ games for the upcoming quarter prepared, show students some activities they will be playing.
